This document has been prepared to explain in detail the Operation of Air Transat Virtual. This will go into detail on the website as well as the operations of PIREPS and Flights. These rules are to be followed if pilots choose to fly for this VA. Failure to do so may result in bids not going through or being removed.

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3. Permission

3.1 Simulators

We allow all simulators within reason. We mainly run on Prepar3D, XPlane 11 XPlane 12 and MSFS 2020 and 2024

3.2 Software


To track, and book schedules and the entire network will be run through NewSky. Newsky is operational and running, pilots will be required to book flights and fly them through NewSky's system. To learn new about NewSky's operation, proceed to page 10 for more information

3.3 Our Policy

4. Navigating the website

4.1 Home page

This is where all the information you need to know is located. This includes our features, where to go if you need help, and a disclaimer at the bottom.

4.2 Route map

The route map displays what routes Air Transat fly in real life and they are to be followed as they would in the real world. The map indicates the summer schedule and during fall, winter, and spring schedules some of the destinations may not be listed. Destinations with the star icon* are year-round destinations.

4.3 Fleet

This is the True to Life Air Transat fleet and it is to be followed. No Substitutions are to be made without explicit permission from staff.

4.4 Contact

On this page, there is a link to our contact form that is monitored 24/7. If you encounter a problem or have any concerns, please feel free to use that link to report.

Reasons to use this would include

- General Inquiry
- Reporting someone
- Leave of absence
- Reporting a bug

4.7 File PIREP


Once a pilot has arrived it is required that the pilot close the flight on Newsky. Once the pilot has done that the PIREP will automatically be filled



5 Newsky

5.1 Joining the Virtual Airline

To join Air Transat Virtual's profile you must first create an account and log in. Once that has been completed, find the "Search Airlines tab located on the left menu. Then type in "Air Transat Virtual" or type "TSV" in the search bar. Currency is irrelevant so please ignore it



Once you have created an account, it must be activated by doing a flight. The distance and aircraft choice for this flight do not matter. Once you have done those steps you should be all set

5.2 Help with Newsky

If you encounter any problems, ask for help from our server and if the problem is not resolved, go to the Newsky FAQ https://wiki.newsky.app/

5.3 Bidding a flight

To BID a flight you must do it through NewSky.

Once you have made an account and have joined the TSC VA server you will be allowed to BID a flight with no aircraft restrictions (Get familiar with the aircraft beforehand or NewSky and the VA could charge you)

To bid a flight here are the steps




Click the Icon to the right of your name



Please press Schedule PAX and select the Air Transat Virtual Airline profile on the next page



3. Fill out the appropriate fields including Aircraft, Departure, Arrival, OFF time, and Weights only if applicable



4. You have created the flight, Newsky will allow you to generate an OFP through Simbrief by clicking the clipboard icon



- 5. The Newsky application MUST be running in the background for the flight to be logged properly.
- 6. Once you have arrived at your final destination, you are permitted to close the flight

5.4 Aircraft within Newsky

Newsky tracks where the aircraft are based on their last flight flown (C-GOIF were to be flown from CYUL-LFPG, C-GOIF will be in LFPG until moved back). If you wish to move a certain aircraft you can ask a pilot within the discord server or you may ask a staff member to do so. Use the appropriate aircraft for what is selected, (Compensation will be added in the future). If there are any problems in the future, please let us know.

5.5 Limitations

For flights over the Atlantic Ocean, the aircraft must be ETOPS certified. This includes the A321Neo LR, A330-200 A330-300. Flights over the Atlantic Ocean in the A320-200, A321-200, B737-800, or B737-700 will be disregarded.

5.5.1 Legacies


For those who wish to fly legacy fleet members, reach the certain hours required, or ask a staff member. The legacies are the A310-300, B737-700/-800 and the L1011(substituted by the MD11).

5.6 Departure and Arrival Information.

Those requiring Departure Gates, Arrival Gates or Flight Requests for Vatsim events ONLY may do so in the discord server under #dispatch-requests (see more for the formatting and requests)

5.7 Newsky ICAO vs Real ICAO

PLEASE NOTE, For our Newsky page at the moment we are not allowed to use the real Air Transat ICAO code. When you fly on vatsim, please be sure to use the real Air Transat ICAO code "TSC".



7.1 landing page


On the landing page, the only important information here is the time in Zulu. On the sidebar or the hamburger dropbox, there is a list of our recommended pilot tools as well as our implemented Newsky page.

7.2 Pilots tools

This drop-down menu holds some of the necessities you will need when flying for Air Transat Virtual. This includes a free source of Charts, Simbrief, a free source of weather, a map of Newsky servers and links for requesting oceanic clearance. Everything a pilot could need for flying on vatsim!

7.3 Crew page

This is where we implemented Newsky and our page. It is 100% usable but may be a bit small as we cannot implement the true scale of the original website. See chapter 5 for information on how to use Newsky



8. Regional Operations

8.1 Summary

In November 2023, Porter Airlines and Air Transat entered into a joint venture aimed at enhancing their market positions and expanding their reach. This collaboration allows both carriers to coordinate pricing, schedules, and revenue sharing, building upon a year-old code-share agreement that had already increased Air Transat's traveler count by 60,000.

For Porter, this partnership opens access to European and southern destinations served by Air Transat, complementing its existing network. Conversely, Air Transat benefits from Porter's growing presence in Canada and the United States, facilitating better connections and more competitive pricing.

The joint venture intensifies competition with Canada's largest carrier, Air Canada, by strengthening Porter and Air Transat's positions on major domestic and transatlantic routes. Analysts note that this alliance could pressure prices and alter the competitive landscape in both domestic and transatlantic travel markets.

Overall, the partnership aims to broaden both airlines' networks, offering passengers more destinations and improved connectivity. Porter plans to expand its fleet to 79 aircraft by 2025, supporting this growth.

8.2 Operations

!IMPORTANT!

IN NEWSKY, ALL REGIONAL FLIGHTS ARE QUADRUPLE DIGIT FLIGHT NUMBERS (ext TSV2577) All flights with quadruple digit flight numbers, or flow by E190's or DH8D, are flow and operated by Porter Airlines inc.

8.3 Porter hubs

With Porter Airlines becoming our regional options for pilots to fly it is to note that they use the same terminals as Air Transat. HOWEVER the new hub for Porter is CYTZ, ABSOLUTELY NO commercial airliners bigger than a Dash 8-Q400 are permitted to land there. If pilots ignore this rule, the PIREP will be removed and the pilot may receive disciplinary actions including account suspension.
